Client Spotlight

Sean, 18 years old, contacted Build Futures in August of 2012. He was homeless and had lost his job and someone had stolen his wallet with his ID and social security card. He never knew his father and his mother's boyfriend had thrown him out. He was 18. Build Futures rented a shared room for him near our office. He began helping at Build Futures while we worked to get his documentation. A combination of problems resulted in it taking three months to get his ID and



social security card. During this time, Build Futures worked with him to get his high school diploma. He learned internet skills while working with us. We gave him a bike for transportation and ended up paying his rent for four months. Once he had his documents he found a job quickly with a parts company selling their parts online based on his experience with Build Futures. Seven months later, he was making \$13 an hour. He recently sent us a picture with him in a tux taking a girl to prom. **His life has been transformed.**

One interesting side note is that Sean made it a point to tell us that they wanted to charge so much to rent a tux that he did research and found an outlet where he was able to buy everything, including shoes, for much less. He said he remembered we told him to get things for free or really cheap whenever possible and always do your research before buying.

Instead of going back to school, homeless kids are struggling to find a safe place to sleep. Help us get them off the streets and into a safe place, where they can rest, eat and start a new life.

Differences

But there is a difference in how they live. For many of these kids, the backpack they carry posses all their belongings. The clothes they wear don't change daily. And the "bed-head" hairstyle was not formed for style, but was fashioned out of hardship.

Working through Adversity

You don't see Build Futures' kids on the side of a freeway holding a sign or walking through a parking lot asking for money. You see Build Futures' kids at the same places you would see your own.

A "Normal" Day

And as normal as these kids look, their daily routines are anything but. How would you feel if you saw your son's teammate pull the Starbucks coffee cup you just threw away from the trash so they could get a free cup of coffee? What would you think if you observed your daughter's classmate waiting for patrons to leave a half-eaten meal on the table so she could sit down and enjoy a meal? Would it spur you to act if you noticed a kid from your neighborhood go into a park bathroom at dusk to clean up before heading out to find a "safe place" for sleeping?

It's not a Choice...

Build Futures' kids were teammates, classmates and neighbors. Some have had to flee abusive, dysfunctional family lives. Some were left with nowhere to go when a parent became very ill and/or died. And some attend school and work, but don't make enough to provide shelter for themselves. These kids don't choose to be homeless, but life's circumstances have given them no other choice.

You can give them another choice by donating to Build Futures to give these kids a safe place to sleep and a fresh start.

Within a very short time, Jeremy, has entrenched himself into the inner workings of Build Futures. He plans to further his education as a Graduate in Social Work and continue to further develop Build Futures' collaboration with other nonprofits and the community we serve.
